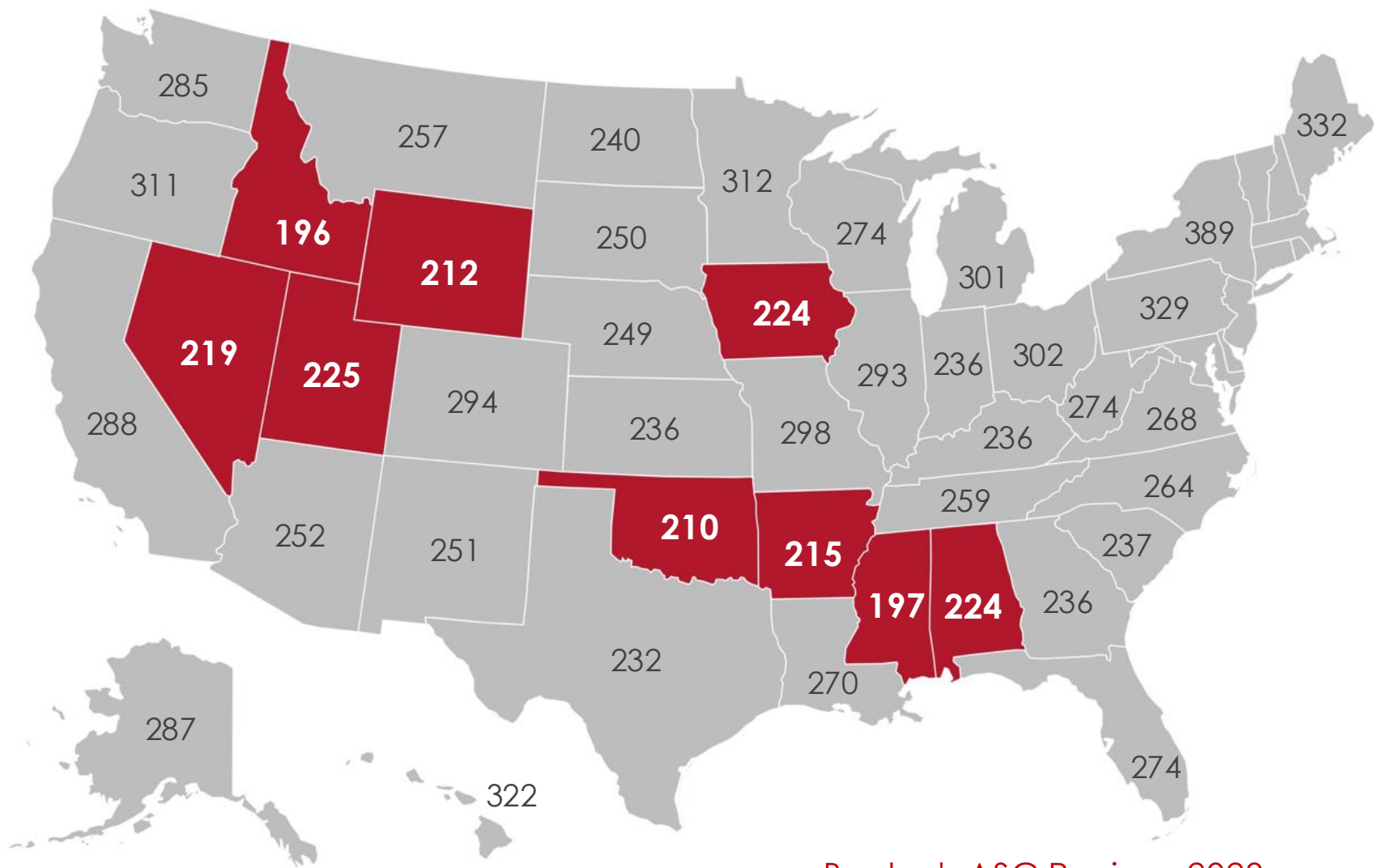

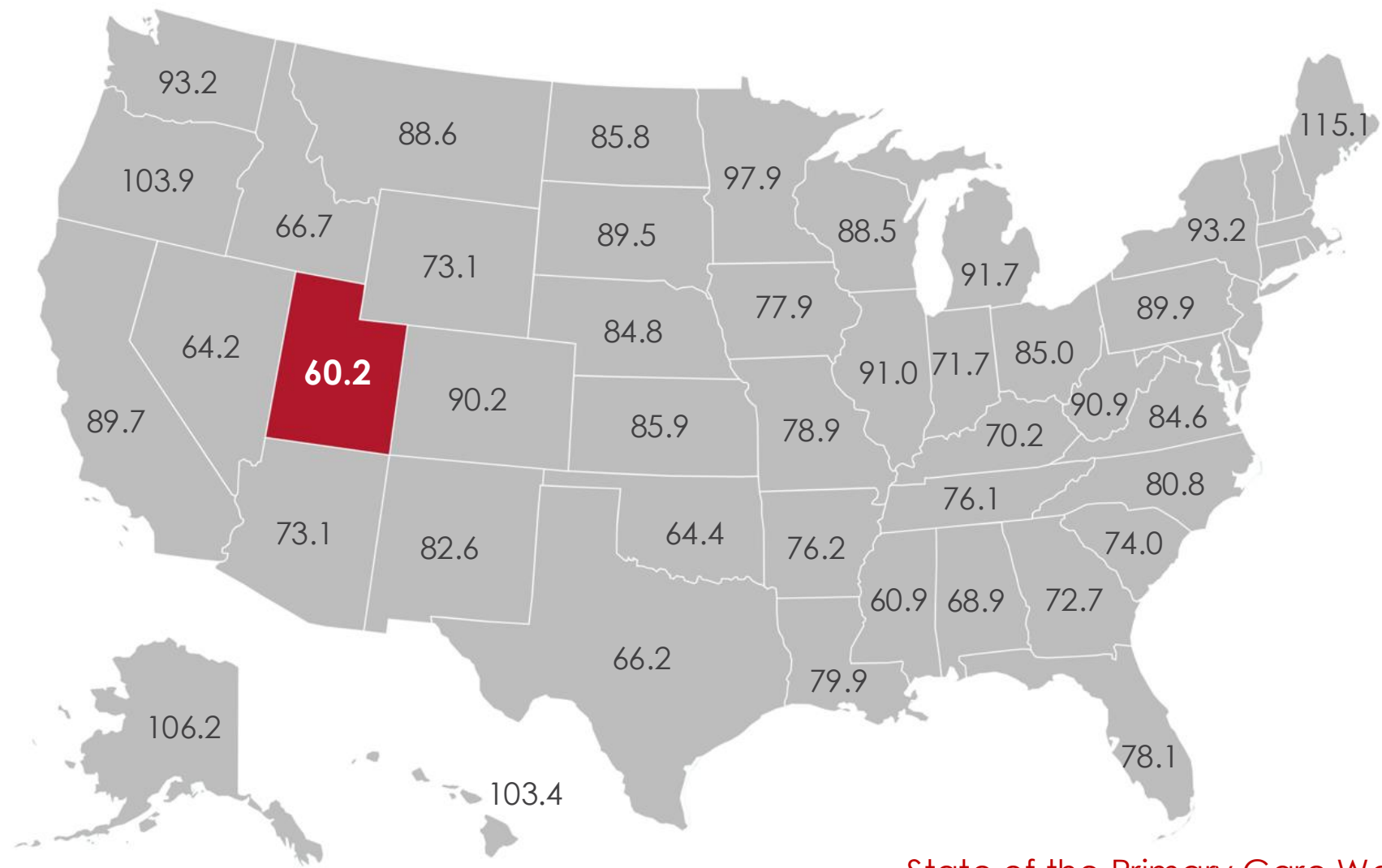

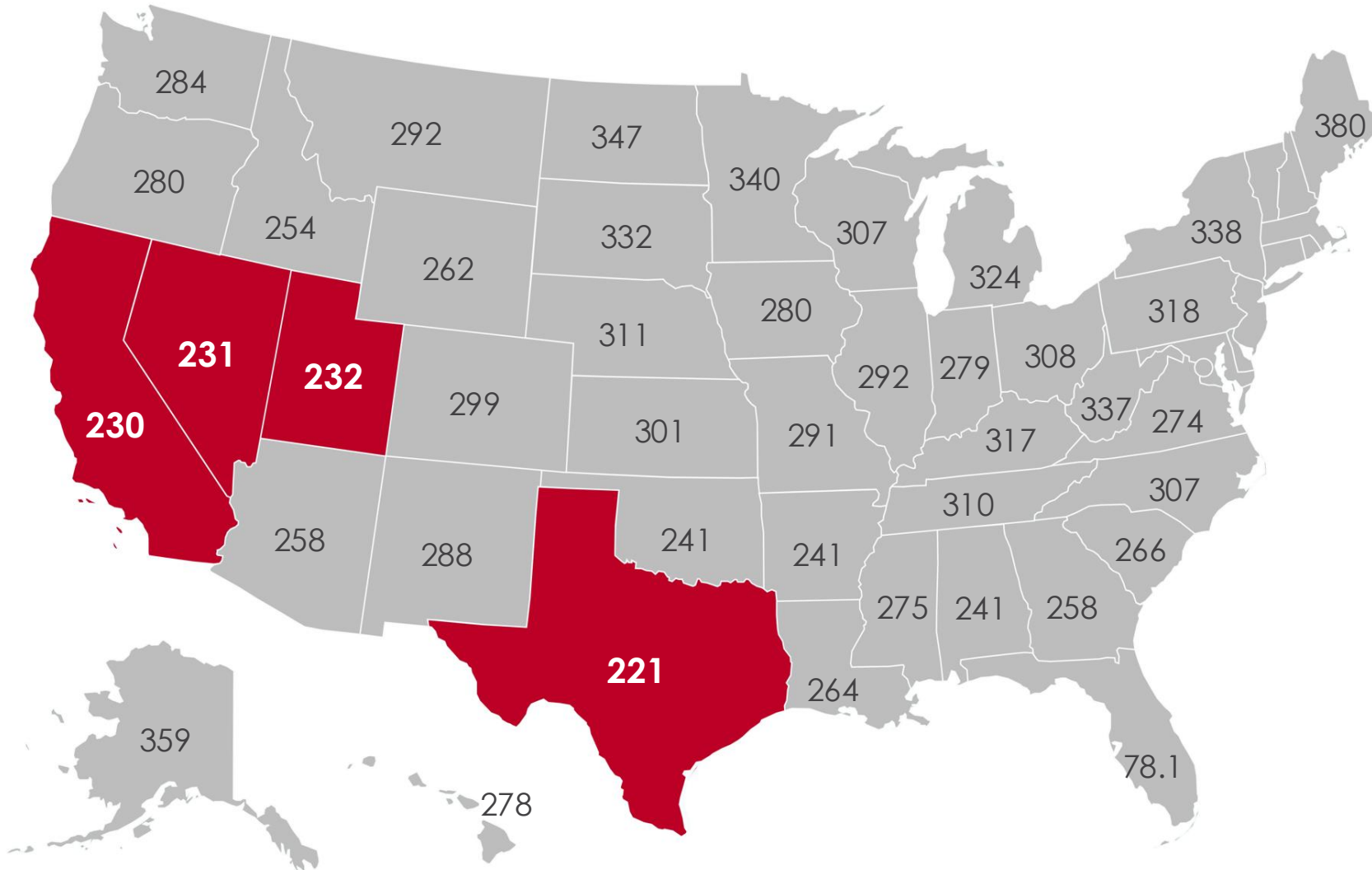

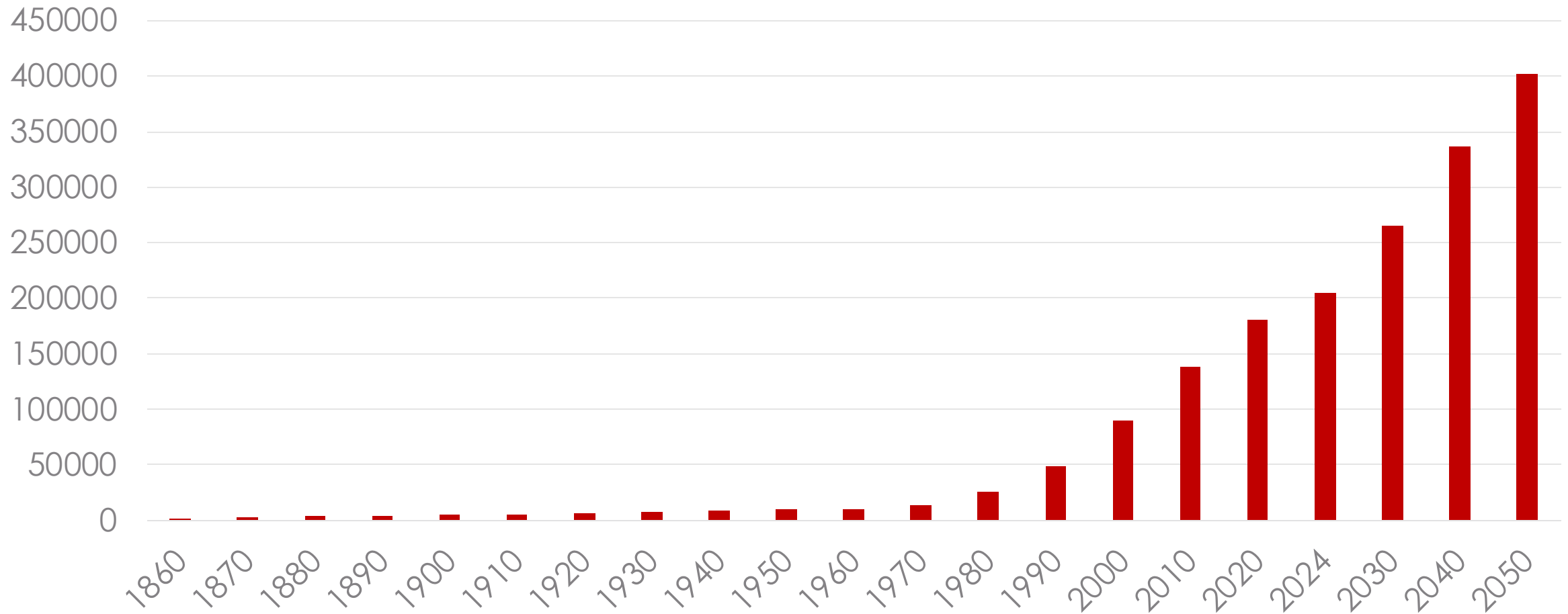

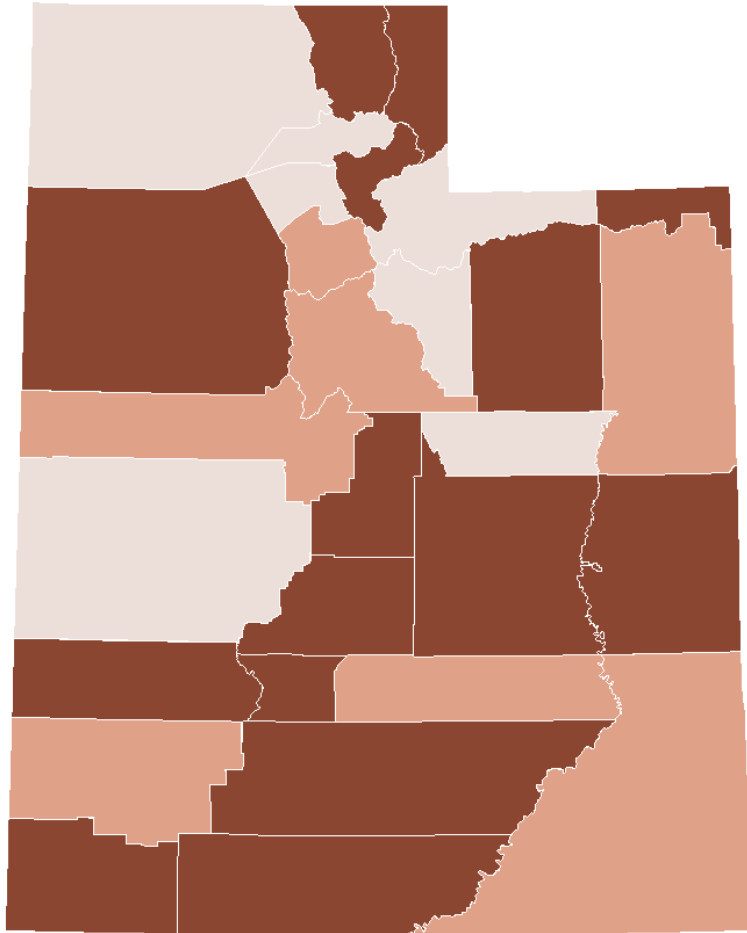
Washington County Population & Projected Growth



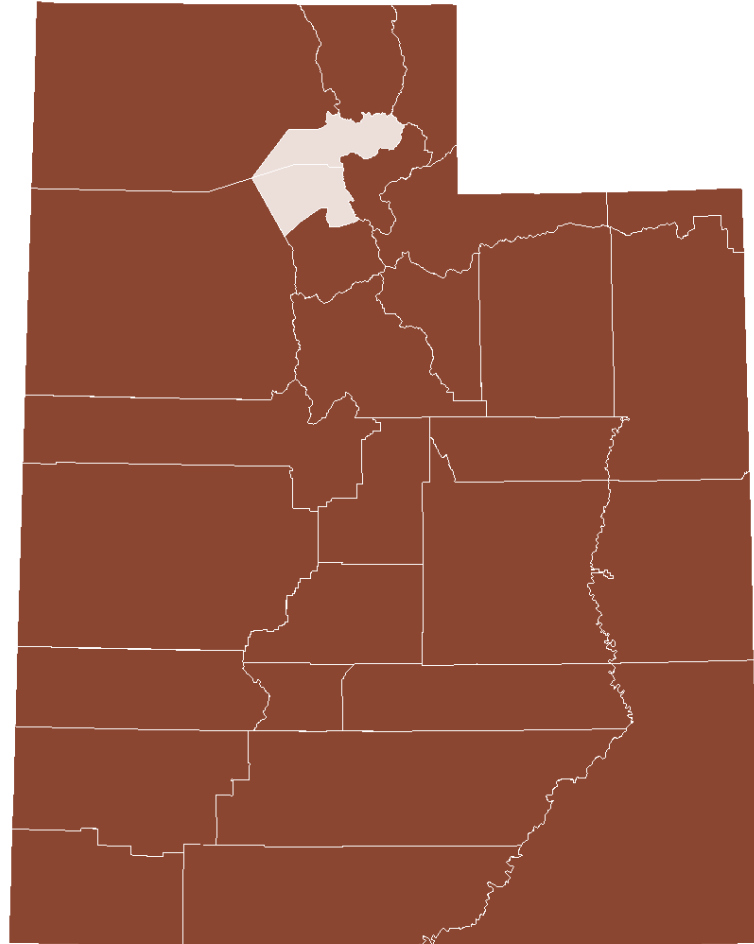

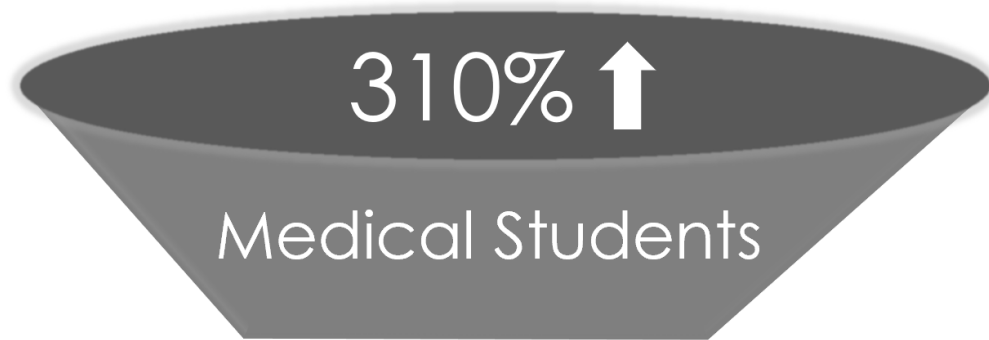

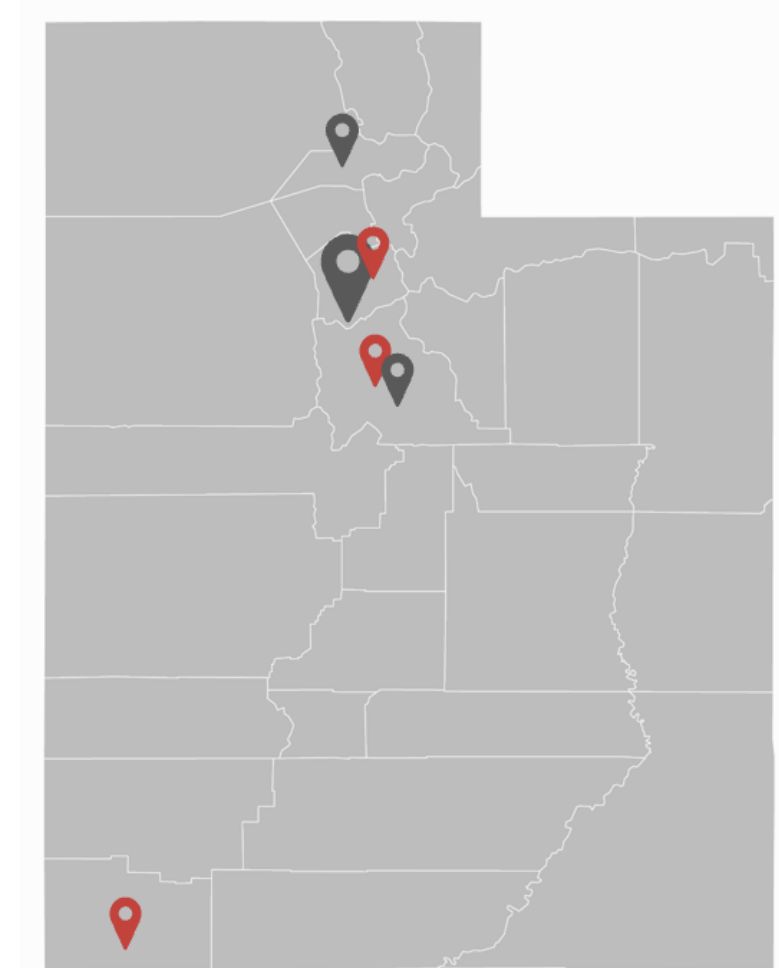
